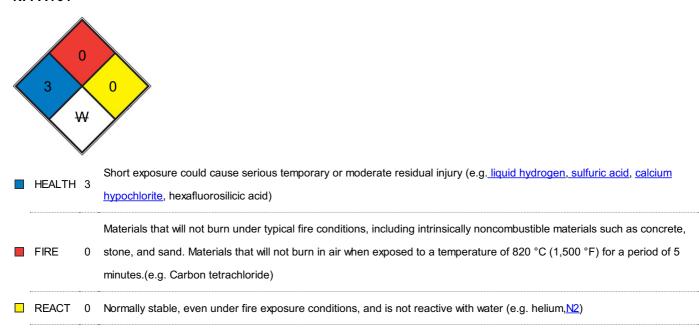

SECTION 6: Accidental release measures
