SYMPTOMS: Symptoms of exposure to this compound may include vomiting, diarrhea, anorexia and mild central nervous system depression. ACUTE/CHRONIC HAZARDS: When heated to decomposition this compound emits acrid smoke and fumes. (NTP, 1992)

Indication of any immediate medical attention and special treatment needed

Immediate first aid: Ensure that adequate decontamination has been carried out. If patient is not breathing, start artificial respiration, preferably with a demand valve resuscitator, bag-valve-mask device, or pocket mask, as trained. Perform CPR if necessary. Immediately flush contaminated eyes with gently flowing water. Do not induce vomiting. If vomiting occurs, lean patient forward or place on the left side (headdown position, if possible) to maintain an open airway and prevent aspiration. Keep patient quiet and maintain normal body temperature. Obtain medical attention. Poisons A and B



Methods and materials for containment and cleaning up

SRP: Wastewater from contaminant suppression, cleaning of protective clothing/equipment, or contaminated sites should be contained and evaluated for subject chemical or decomposition product concentrations. Concentrations shall be lower than applicable environmental discharge or disposal criteria. Alternatively, pretreatment and/or discharge to a permitted wastewater treatment facility is acceptable only after review by the governing authority and assurance that "pass through" violations will not occur. Due consideration shall be given to remediation worker exposure (inhalation, dermal and ingestion) as well as fate during treatment, transfer and disposal. Toxicity

Toxicity to fish: LC50 - Cyprinodon variegatus - 3.49 mg/L - 96 h.

Toxicity to daphnia and other aquatic invertebrates: EC50 - Daphnia magna - 510 µg/L - 48 h.

Persistence and degradability

AEROBIC: The half-life of piperonyl butoxide in aerobic soils was reported as 14 days(1). Degradation in soil or water is mainly via oxidation of the butyl side chain to form methylenedioxypropyl benzyl alcohol followed by the corresponding aldehyde, ultimately with mineralization to carbon dioxide; there is no accumulation of the metabolites(1).

Bioaccumulative potential

An estimated BCF of 27 was calculated in fish for piperonyl butoxide(SRC), using a log Kow of 4.75(1) and a regression-derived equation(2). According to a classification scheme(3), this BCF suggests the potential for bioconcentration in aquatic organisms is low, provided the compound is not metabolized by the organism(SRC).

Mobility in soil

The Koc of piperonyl butoxide ranges from 399-830(1). According to a classification scheme(2), these Koc values suggest that piperonyl butoxide is expected to have moderate to low mobility in soil.

Disposal methods

Product

The material can be disposed of by removal to a licensed chemical destruction plant or by controlled incineration with flue gas scrubbing. Do not contaminate water, foodstuffs, feed or seed by storage or disposal. Do not discharge to sever systems.

Contaminated packaging

Containers can be triply rinsed (or equivalent) and offered for recycling or reconditioning. Alternatively, the packaging can be punctured to make it unusable for other purposes and then be disposed of in a sanitary landfill. Controlled incineration with flue gas scrubbing is possible for combustible packaging materials.
